General Manager Pete Vitola will be working with our entire staff to provide continuity across all our departments and ensuring we are effectively covering all our bases during this change over.

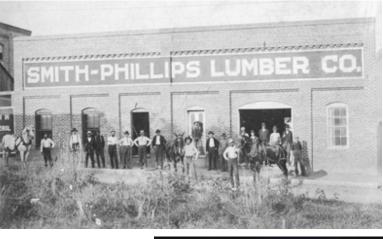
